We often talk about church growth and wonder how to do it. But before we think about how to do it, we need to ask ourselves what we think it is, and why we should do it? So ahead of our busiest season for visitors, let's just stop and think about what we're doing, why we're doing it, and what we hope will happen as a result.

First, what is church growth? At one level, we're talking about our parish churches, but more broadly, we're talking about the Kingdom of God. As much as we want to see our local churches grow in numbers, I suspect that just like our other needs, if we seek first God's kingdom and righteousness, all these things will be given to us well (see Matthew 6:28-34). The Bible, particularly the Gospels, tells us about the values of God's Kingdom. Prayer teaches us how God wants us to be involved here and now.

Second, why should we do it? Well, if we don't, we'll have trouble sustaining our services and buildings and paying the parish share. But we know that's not why we do it (that's one of the "all these things will be given to you as well" things). What would it mean to you to see God recognised and worshipped in our villages? What would our villages look like if the fullness of life offered by Jesus was embraced by our neighbours?

Third, how do we do it? How do we bridge the gap between where we are and what we believe God longs for in love for Ashby St Ledgers, Braunston, and Welton? We don't panic, we don't strive by our own efforts, we don't give up. We rejoice that God loves these places and the people in it, we pray "Your Kingdom come, your will be done in Ashby, Braunston, and Welton, as it is in heaven", and we sow seeds of the Kingdom, and we water signs of life – seedlings of faith that we encounter in people.

We need to be faithful in this, but not stressed about it, because it is God's work, not ours. It is God that draws people, and sometimes he gives us the privilege of being involved. St Paul wrote about this to the church in Corinth, emphasising that life always comes from God:

"What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth."

We needn't be anxious about it; we just need to pay attention. I would like to offer two simple things we can all do. The first is for us to use the below "Prayer for growth" which has been published by an organisation called "Leading Your Church Into Growth." The second is to invite someone to one of our upcoming services in December – either the service for remembering loved ones, a gentle space to hold grief before the pressure of the Christmas season, or one of our events of celebration and worship around Christmas itself.
